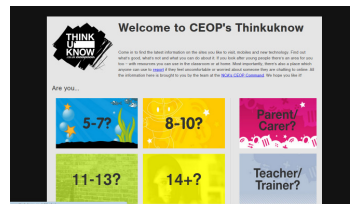
While you're waiting there are also some e-safety stories that we use in school that you might like to have a look at and consider using at home.

On the laptops there are also some e-safety websites that we use in school. They are really child friendly and are a free resource that you could use with your children at home. Here are the links...

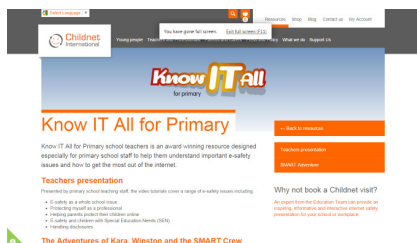
