

Sport Premium Overview of expenditure 2018-19

Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools in the financial year 17-18 was calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January 2017. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils received a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil.

What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).
