



What is Safeguarding?

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and to protect them from harm. This may involve a number of different organizations and agencies, including school.

The happiness, safety and well-being of the children is at the centre of everything we do at Buxton Infant School. Safeguarding is the responsibility of everyone but the structure of our safeguarding is as follows:

We recognise that all families are individual and unique and therefore our Early Help Offer aims to be bespoke to the needs of each of our families. It may just be a cup of tea and a chat or a referral to a specialist service or food bank. It could be benefit advice and support or a more intense support such as an Early Help Assessment and TAF meetings. At all times we aim to be child and family led, friendly and approachable.

Jo Travers-Muir is the Early Help Lead Practitioner. She is able to offer signposting advice, parenting support, referrals to external agencies including the foodbank, clothes bank and local charities, health and Early Help assessments and TAF Meetings. If your child or family is being supported by Social Care or other external agencies Jo will be the point of contact. Jo is also the Family Resource Worker and Early Help Lead at Buxton Junior School meaning support can be coordinated through your family's primary school journey.

Rachael Riley is the Pastoral Family Resource Lead Practitioner and leads many of the school's internal nurture interventions and 1-1 pastoral support. Rachael has a wealth of experience in this field and can also offer individual support to parents and carers including emotional support, parenting support and signposting to appropriate agencies.
